We are no longer contact tracing unless asked by Maricopa County Health Department in specific cases.
Diagnostic and screening testing	Y	Staff is provided with a list of providers for testing and/or screening upon request.
Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities	N	
Appropriate accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies	Y	All efforts will be made to accommodate children with disabilities in regards to implemented health and safety policies in the classroom. Should the student's IEP or physical or emotional well-being require it, the transfer status to Great Hearts online may be offered. Special Education and related services will be provided in accordance with students' IEPs, as is

### How the LEA will Ensure Continuity of Services?

**Regular health and safety screenings are in place as well as additional staff and observation added to help facilitate in-person learning.**

#### Students' Needs:

Academic Needs	Classroom intervention for Tier II reading and Partially Proficient Math students (who are not "far below") is required of the teacher K-5; School-wide "Lincoln Writes Days" to practicing writing process/product and building stamina for AASA. Reading fluency practice sent home nightly with Tier II Reading Interventions being prioritized during the day. Eligible students will receive Reading Intervention despite not being required by MOWR. Eligibility expanded for all students who need academic support of any kind. ELL services are being provided and K-5 Math Interventions for Tier II support.
Social, Emotional, and Mental Health Needs	Teacher survey to find out what the most presenting issues are in the classroom (45 day screens). Student survey, when/where appropriate. Training teachers on mental health warning signs, and then having them refer as necessary. School Counselor will do needs assessments; and use 45 Day Screen and observations to identify needs of school. School counselor will use programs approved by GHA for whole groups, guidance lessons, small groups, and individual counseling sessions. Training for staff & parents. Individual counseling. Group counseling. Guidance lessons.
Other Needs (which may include student health and food services)	School will follow CDC's "No Share" Food Policy; All Faculty trained in identifying symptoms of illness specific to COVID-19 and instructed to take immediate action when students appear to be exhibiting symptoms, partnering with our Health Office.

#### Staff Needs:

Social, Emotional, and Mental Health Needs	Administration will add observation opportunities within classrooms to better monitor and identify needs of staff. The School Counselor will provide on-going responsive professional development at staff training. In addition, Counselor will provide consultation and resources to support staff emotion and social needs. Admin refers staff to EAP Program.
Other Needs	Headmaster check-ins and added availability of administrative staff.

- (a) An LEA must describe in its plan under section 2001(i)(1) of the ARP Act for the safe return to in-person instruction and continuity of services—

    - (I) Coordination with State and local health officials.
  - (ii) how it will ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address students' academic needs and students' and staff social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services.
- (b)(i) During the period of the ARP ESSER award established in section Start Printed Page 212022001(a) of the ARP Act, an LEA must regularly, but no less frequently than every six months (taking into consideration the timing of significant changes to CDC guidance on reopening schools), review and, as appropriate, revise its plan for the safe return to in-person instruction and continuity of services.
- (ii) In determining whether revisions are necessary, and in making any revisions, the LEA must seek public input and take such input into account

- (iii) Upon request by a parent who is an individual with a disability as defined by the ADA, provided in an alternative format accessible to that parent
